This fall "Forty Days for Life" campaign will be held September 23 – November 1, 2015. "Forty Days for Life" is a peaceful, non-denominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities and educational outreach with the goal of protecting mothers and their children from abortion. Since 2007 at least 10,331 unborn children have been saved from abortions during 40 Days of Life campaigns and 60 facilities have been closed.
